BASIC TENDENCIES OF FOREIGN POLICY OF POLAND ARE DURING STAY AT POWER OF PRESIDENT O. KVASNEVSKIY

A republic is Poland one of the first countries of CSE began to change priorities of foreign policy and oriented on the European and evroatlantich structures. In 1999 year a country enters into NATO, and in 2004 years - to ES. Change of foreign-policy orientiriv of Poland in behalf of NATO and ES accompanied changes in its relationships with neighbours on East.

Moving by integration with the West, Poland aimed to reconstruct the mutual relations of partnership and collaboration with countries on East. This publication is an attempt to analyse present researches from a theme and light up the general tendencies of development of foreign policy of RP a period there are 1995-2005 years.

The feature of Poland in the questions of international safety and oversea policy was that both rulings political forces and opposition almost always occupied similar position, oriented westward.

Kvas'nevskiy came forward for continuation of reforms, integration of Poland, with the European structures, entry of country in NATO taking into account support of good-neighbourlinesses with Russia. Understanding of O. Kvas'nevskiy the necessity of normal relations of Poland with Russia reflected pragmatism. On the Washingtonian summit of 1999 president Kvas'nevskiy heads delegation of RP, which is the certificate of him active voice in preparation to the entry of Poland in NATO. On February, 26, 1999 he signed documents which ratified Polish membership in NATO. On April, 20, 1999 RP officially becomes the member of NATO.

In April in 2003 Evroparlament and Advice of European Union confirmed suggestion in relation to including of Poland to ES. On May, 1 in 2004 Poland became the member of ES officially. Festive acceptance 10 the states to ES it took place in Dublin. This event completed difficult almost 15-years-old setup time,

during what RP consistently executed the terms of reception in ES, and simultaneously marked beginning of new period in life of country.
